Find out about the everyday lives of children in ancient Rome, using a selection of historical source materials. Write an imaginative diary entry, from the point of view of a Roman child, that includes correct historical information.	Time yourself to see how quickly you can write or recite all of the times tables up to 12X12. Record your time and see if you can beat this next week. Make sure an adult checks your answers.	Use a range of sources to create a timeline, showing the chronology of the Roman Empire from 753 BC to AD 476. Highlight the dates that show when the Romans were in Britain.
The Romans worshiped many different gods. Find out about these gods and write a short profile about each one. Jupiter Diana Pluto Mars Juno	Find $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ of different amounts, you could share the number out using jottings or by sharing counters or blocks. To challenge yourself, find $\frac{1}{3}$ of the numbers too! For example, $\frac{1}{2}$ of 10 = 5	With an adult, find a picture of a Roman soldier. Print or draw the image then label their clothing and armour. You can challenge yourself and describe the clothing and armour.

Remember to measure the length of each side and add them together. Is the perimeter of your bedroom smaller or bigger than the kitchen?	The Romans worshiped many different gods.
