

Science

The beginning of the term the children will be focussing on learning all about sound! This project teaches children about sound, how sound is made and how sound travels as vibrations through a medium to the ear. They learn about pitch and volume and find out how both can be changed.

The second half of the term the children will be following the topic Potions. This project will develop children's knowledge of the properties of materials. Children learn the properties of solids, liquids and gases, recognise hazardous materials and learn how and why medicines, such as anaesthetics, were developed.

PE-Games

Over the first term; half the class will be going swimming where they will develop confidence in the water whilst knowing how to remain safe. The other class will work on their gymnastic and dance skills.




English

Over the term, the children will focus their writing based on their topic. They will begin with creating a set of instructions. They will look closely at what writing features they will need to include to make every step very clear. Their second piece of writing will be to get creative and write an engaging narrative. They will develop creative techniques to engage their reader!

Through the different tasks set they will use a high level of new language. They will also follow the Talk for Writing process to help them structure their writing. The children will begin to develop their use of language and writing for a purpose.

Maths

Children will continue to develop their fluency of the times tables. They will also apply their knowledge of the four operations to the topic 'Fractions and Decimals'.



DT

This term the children will be looking at how to make the perfect bath bomb! They will research current products and use their new scientific knowledge to create their own bath bomb. They will evaluate their product once it has been created!

Knowledge and understanding of the world

This term in RE, the children will be exploring what is known as a 'big question' which is: 'How do people from religious and non-religious communities celebrate key festivals?'

Uniform
