## <u>Geography</u>

In term 5, your child will embark on an exciting journey exploring the diverse aspects of our planet. Through a series of engaging activities and projects, they will develop essential skills and knowledge essential for understanding the world around them. They will explore- features of Earth, time zones, lines of latitude and longitude, map skills, climate change, analyse data, human settlement and global trade.



### PE-Athletics

In term 5, year 6 students will focus on fundamental movement skills like running, jumping, and throwing in PE and athletics. They'll engage in various activities such as sprinting, long jump, and shot put, emphasizing teamwork and sportsmanship. Through training sessions and friendly competitions, children will improve their athletic abilities, understanding of sports tactics, and the importance of warm-up routines and nutrition for optimal performance.



## <u>English</u>

In term 5, year 6 students will delve into the captivating theme of "Our Changing World" in English. Through a variety of texts, including fiction, non-fiction, and poetry, children will embark on a literary journey to explore the dynamic transformations our world has undergone. They will analyse, world shifts, technological advancements, and environmental changes represented in the texts. Through discussions, creative writing tasks, and critical analysis, the children will develop a deeper understanding of the complexities of our evolving world, developing their comprehension, writing, and critical thinking skills along the way.



#### <u>Maths</u>

We will dive into a range of mathematical concepts designed to deepen the children's understanding and problem-solving skills. Topics include advanced fractions, decimals, and percentages, along with geometry, statistics, and algebraic reasoning. The children will develop fluency, reasoning, and mathematical resilience, preparing them for the SATs papers.

## <u>Art and Design</u>

This project introduces students to environmental art, exploring how artists address social and political issues concerning natural and urban environments. Through study and collaboration, the children will create artwork with environmental messages, fostering creativity, critical thinking and environmental awareness.

# Knowledge and understanding of the world.

The students will tackle the big question:
"What can be done to reduce racism? Can
religion help?" Through study and discussion
of religious teachings, ethics, and values,
children will explore how different faith
traditions promote tolerance, empathy, and
equality. They'll engage in dialogue,
reflection, and practical activities aimed at
fostering an understanding of our
communities and world.

#### Uniform

All clothing needs to be labelled clearly please, especially jumpers/cardigans. PE will take place every week, unless otherwise stated, so please ensure your child arrives in full PE kit on **Friday**. They can wear black shorts or jogging bottoms, a coloured t-shirt and plain black trainers. The colour of their t-shirt needs to be the same colour as the team your child is inred, blue, green or yellow.

#### Reading

Your child has a reading book and a reading record book to take home every night. This needs to come in to school every day.

Your child is given homework every Friday. Homework is to be returned by the following Thursday morning.
