

## English

Throughout this term we will be looking into woodland stories such as Hansel and Gretel and Stickman. We will be writing our own stories, recounting stories, writing instructions and a letter. This will be a great opportunity for us to practice writing fiction and non-fiction pieces.

## Science

In Science, we will be spending a lot of time looking closely at plants and their life cycles, particularly different trees that we find in our local area. We will be looking at the process of change over time, ways of melting ice and animal habitats. We will also be looking at everyday materials.

## PE

This term, they will be taking part in the unit 'hit, catch, run'. During their PE sessions they will be learning to hit objects with a bat or hand, track and retrieve a rolling ball and throw and catch a variety of balls and objects.
