In our upcoming topic "The Circulatory System," we will look into the vibrant world of blood. They'll discover the importance of blood donation and learn strategies for maintaining a healthy heart through cardiovascular exercise and nutritious eating habits.

English

Maths

In Term 6, we will explore "The Heart and Maths," linking mathematical concepts with science to measure and analyse heart rates. Design and Technology
