ART and DT:

- Sketch some arctic animals
- Create a landscape of the arctic using paint as your medium
- Junk model your own frozen kingdom
- Create your own arctic animal out of junk modelling

Geography:

- Create a poster informing your audience about climate change
- Locate the arctic circle and present your findings however you would like
- Find out about how the indigenous people survive in the arctic.

Computing:

- Find a virtual reality experience on YouTube of the arctic.
- Create a PowerPoint on any research you can find about the Arctic or the Antarctic
- Use 'Scratch' to make your own computer game up.

PE/Performing Arts:

- Create your own PE game based around the topic of 'Frozen Kingdoms'
- Write your own song
- Perform a dance and record it to a song relatable to the topic

History:

- Research The Titanic and present your findings
- Research Shackleton's Journey and present your findings

English:

- Write a letter to Boris Johnson informing him about the impact climate change is having on the arctic.
- Write a non-chronological report about your findings of The Titanic.
- Write a diary entry as Shackleton whilst on his Expedition.
- Create a tourism brochure for those that wish to visit The Arctic – do not forget to advise them on what they would need to survive!

Maths:

- Create your own Maths Mystery game that uses all of the mathematical skills we have learnt so far this year.
- Create a maths board game using characters from the 'Frozen Kingdom'
- Write the co-ordinates of the Arctic Circle. Could you write this into your own maths question?

Science:

- Discover what animals live in The Arctic and find out how they are adapted to live there.
- Research 'classification' and research arctic animals. Present your findings and make sure you use a key appropriately.
- Create your own investigation into how and why the icebergs are melting in The Arctic. Try to video or take pictures of your experiment.
